



Student Expectations and Guidance on our School Reopening March 2021

We are delighted to be welcoming you back into school on the above dates. We know you will have been working hard at home to complete your school work from home and all staff at William Farr are looking forward to seeing you in school again.

You will remember from last term the different measures the school had to take to create an environment to allow all our school community to attend school safely. Many of these measures are still in place, but as was the case last term, it can only work if we all work together and follow the expectations in this document.

As well as the existing safety measures, there are some important new health and safety changes issued by the Government and you need to be aware of these. It is essential that you follow these when in school for the benefit of the whole school community. We must all play our part.



Returning to school

We know some of you will be apprehensive about coming to school, but we are confident that we can all safely work together as a community so that we can continue to 'live life in all its fullness'.

Remember, it is perfectly normal to feel nervous and a bit stressed in anticipation of coming back. It is important to know that you are not alone in this and that for the vast majority of people, it will feel much better once they are in school and have seen their friends and teachers!

If you have any concerns or worries, make sure you speak to your Form Tutor or Head of Year early, who are best placed to offer support or point you towards other help if required.

If you have borrowed a laptop from the school for remote learning, we urgently require them to be returned. Please return the laptop to your Head of Year on the first day of your return to school with the power lead.

This document has been written to help you understand what the school day will look like on your return. The most important message is:

'Stay safe and keep others safe!'

Should I come to School?

It is the Government's expectation that all students should return full time to their schools. Page 1 has the date when you need to return to school.

However, in line with Government advice; please **do not** come to school if you or anyone in your household has:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste
- has had a positive test

If you have symptoms or have tested positive for Covid-19, you must not attend school for at least 10 days from the day after the start of your symptoms or the test date if you did not have symptoms but have had a positive test.

If you are contacted by the NHS '**Test and Trace**' system; you **MUST** follow their advice.

Arrival at School in the Morning

Please arrive between **8.45am and 9.00am**. Please **DO NOT** arrive any earlier!



Please note:

- **Normal school rules** with regards to behaviour and expectations will apply both in school and travelling to and from school.
 - **Leave mobile phones at home.** Due to health and safety reasons and the risks of different people handling equipment, there will be no facility to hand them in at reception. They are not permitted in school.
 - As per Government guidelines; **please come to school in normal full school uniform.** Uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of the school and setting an appropriate tone. Uniforms do not need to be cleaned any more often than usual, nor do they need to be cleaned using methods which are different from normal.
 - Students are now required to wear a **face covering inside school buildings, including in lessons and when travelling between lessons in corridors.** The exception to this is in PE as wearing a face covering would impact on your ability to take part in the lesson. **Coverings do not need to be worn outdoors** or during breaks and lunchtime when students are eating and drinking. Face visors or shields should not be worn as an alternative to face coverings. Safe wearing of face coverings requires the cleaning/sanitising of hands before and after touching (including to remove or put them on) and the safe storage of them in individual sealable plastic bags between uses. You must bring spare masks in your school bag.
 - Furthermore, students must:
 - Not touch the front of their face covering during use or when removing it
 - Dispose of temporary face coverings in a 'black bag' waste bin (not recycling bin)
 - Place reusable face coverings in a plastic bag they can take home with them
 - Maintain good hygiene when using face coverings, for example, handwashing/sanitising before and after using coverings.
 - It is expected that once on the school site, students will not leave the site until the end of the school day. This will include Sixth Form students.
- **Walking to School** - it is your responsibility to walk to school sensibly, observing appropriate social-distancing rules, where safe to do so. When entering the school site, you must stay on the footpath around the car park.

- **Arrival by Car** - please use **ONLY the front car park** (there will be no parental access to the rear car park). Follow the clearly marked signage for drop off and pick up. Please can only students get out of cars, with parents remaining in vehicles.
- **Arrival by Bus** – Government advice is to only use buses if there is no other way to get to school. When dismissed at the end of the day, you will be put on the buses in your year-group bubbles. When travelling to school at the start of the day, it is your responsibility to maintain this. Face coverings are compulsory on all buses (school and public). If you are removing a face covering, it should be placed in a small plastic bag and then kept in your school bag. Disposable face covering should be placed in the bin. Current advice is that buses should be running as normal.

- **Arrival by Bicycle** – as per normal routine, as soon as you are on the school site, please dismount and wheel your bike along the pedestrian path to the bike sheds. It is expected that helmets are worn and bikes are locked up when left unattended.

When arriving at school, you MUST use the entrance described by duty staff and signage. This remains the same as last term. This will vary by year group and will lead you to your designated area of the school, which will include your tutor room.

When you enter your tutor room in the morning, you MUST wash your hands with the sanitiser provided. This must be done sensibly and responsibly.

The School Day

We are planning to resume the timings of the normal school day so you should be at school ready to **start at 9.00am and will finish by 3.45pm.**

You will, as much as possible, stay within your **'year-group bubble' or 'social bubble'**. The day has been designed to limit interaction with people from other year groups during the day by staggering lunchtimes and release times at the end of the day.

Your lessons will be in your normal teaching rooms as far as possible.

Sixth Form students will continue to be 2 separate bubbles; the designated areas being the Study Room for Year 12 and Resources for Year 13.

Resources is not accessible to any other year group apart from Year 13. If students have appointments with Student Welfare/Careers/staff, they will be permitted to access Resources, but will need to maintain social distancing and wear a face covering as usual.

Tutor Rooms continue to be organised into year-group bubbles for the start of the day in Tutor Time and PSME to try to keep year groups together.

Absence

Attendance in school will be compulsory for all students from the designated dates on Page 1 and this will be monitored accordingly.

If you are not able to attend school, please could your parents/carers ring the school before 9.00am and inform us of your absence with a reason.

Telephone the school number **01673 866900** and when prompted choose option 1 (Pupil Absence) and leave a message.

When on site

It is important that everyone cooperates with the systems put in place to try and keep everyone safe.

If you start to feel ill during the school day – you must let your teacher know. Someone will collect you and escort you to the medical room.

If you need to go home, school will arrange this, **so please ask your parents/carers to ensure their contact details are up to date on Progresso.**

Where possible, keep 2 metres away from staff and 1 meter away from students not in your year-group bubble.

Observe Social Distancing between other students not in your bubble and all staff when travelling around the school site.

Always follow the clearly marked one-way signs to navigate around the school. There is also a map on the school website to help.

Keep your possessions with you at all times when you are in school. Don't leave bags or coats outside at break and lunch unattended, so that they can be kept safe and you know no-one else has been in contact with them.

Bring only what is needed for the school day, not the whole week! You MUST NOT leave anything at school. Take home all bags and belongings at the end of each day.



Assemblies

Weekly year-group assemblies will continue to take place remotely, alternating between the main themed assemblies and celebration assemblies. Assemblies will be viewed by students in their form rooms.

Toilets

For hygiene reasons, at all times during the school day, please use only the toilets designated for your year-group bubble. Make sure you wash and dry your hands thoroughly after using the toilet.

Observe safe personal hygiene rules

- Bring tissues to school for coughs and sneezes.
(Catch it – bin it – kill it!)
- **Never joke about coughing or sneezing and certainly never spit. This will be dealt with extremely seriously.**
- Use equipment provided to wipe down your desk at the start of your time at your work station.
- Wash your hands regularly and try not to touch things unnecessarily. Only touch your desk and your equipment. Extra handwashing facilities will be provided.
- Try not to touch your face or put pens or other equipment in your mouth.
- Keep your belongings to yourself. As nice as it would be normally, we must not share equipment and particularly food at this time.



Classrooms

Where possible, all desks will face the front to satisfy Government guidelines. Only go into a classroom if you are timetabled to do so; remember other year-group bubbles will be using other parts of the school!

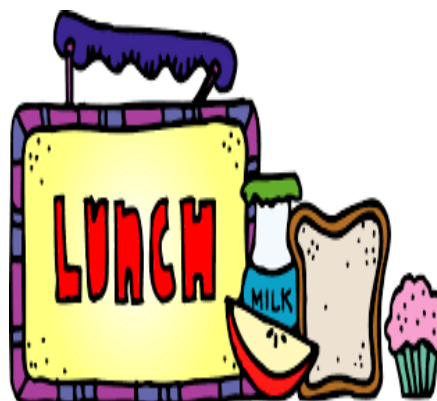
- **Follow teacher instructions and one-way signs for entering buildings.** Each teaching block, both upstairs and down, will have a one-way system to minimise contact between year groups. It is very important you stick to this system to keep us all safe, paying particular attention to direction of travel when leaving a classroom.
- Lining up outside classrooms may cause unnecessary congestion so at the start of a lesson, please go sensibly into the classroom and follow the teacher instructions for starting the lesson.
- **Disinfectant wipes provided** must be used at the start of each lesson to wipe down your work areas and any relevant equipment. These are to be placed in bins provided.
- **Remain at your desk** unless asked to move.
- The teacher will stay at the front of the class. Please do not expect them or Teaching Assistants or any other adults in the classroom to be as mobile as normal.
- **Keep at least two metres away from staff** in lessons if possible.
- **Bring your own pencil cases** – please do not expect to borrow equipment.
- **Toilet breaks** will be discouraged during lesson times unless essential.
- **Use the hand sanitiser** before you leave the room.

Social time (Break and Lunch)

Breaks and lunchtime will continue to be staggered so you are not all in the same social areas or the canteen at the same time.

They will be supervised; however, you **will be expected to take responsibility for your behaviour**, keeping yourself and others safe.

Lunchtime continues to be shorter (30 minutes). This will be enough time to eat and drink and get some fresh air and some responsible social interaction. You will also have two other break times during the day.



Go outside at break and lunchtime if you can to get some fresh air. Only remain inside if and when directed. Tutor rooms and corridors are NOT to be used at lunchtime as social areas. Fresh air is good for you and it allows cleaners to work in classrooms during your breaks. **If it is declared a 'wet lunch', you will be permitted to stay in your Period 3 classroom to eat lunch. If this is a science lab, IT room or D&T area, which are unsuitable for eating, you will go to your indoor bubble area (Dining room or main hall).**

No drinking or eating whilst walking in corridors. Food must only be eaten in the designated areas.

Social Time Bubble Zones

You will be allocated an area of the school as your 'outside space', which you can share with your 'year-group bubble', but kept apart from other year groups. This is for break and lunchtimes. It is important, therefore, that you stay in that space during your social time.

Both the main hall and dining room (depending on your bubble) will be set up for eating lunch and will be cleaned and disinfected between sittings. You may also use the outdoor areas allocated to your group. Please make sure you use the bins provided.

- **Handwashing facilities** have been set up in outside areas. You must wash and dry your hands thoroughly before and after eating.

- **You will be expected to bring your own water bottle and enough water to last the day.** If you do run out of water, for hygiene reasons, the only water fountain available will be in the canteen. This will be supervised and a cleaning regime in place. The only water available to buy will be at lunchtime from the serving counter (fridges and vending machines will not be available).
- **Bring a packed lunch and any snacks you require from home.** The canteen will be available for sandwiches only to be ordered at morning break and then picked up at your lunchtime. A limited range of food will be available to buy at break and lunchtimes (cold/hot snacks/drinks). A cashless point will be available in your designated area where you can buy snacks/drinks.
- There will no breakfast club to avoid bubbles mixing before school.
- **The ‘Squid’ Machine**, used to put money on your cashless catering account, will not be available for use. Please ensure money is put onto your account at home if required.
- **No food or drink is to be shared!**
- **Ball games that do not allow appropriate social distancing or do not fit in your designated social bubble area will not be permitted** and the school reserves the right to ban footballs from the site. The top field will not be available.

In the Event of a Fire or other Emergency

In the event of the fire alarm sounding in lessons, you will be escorted by your teacher out of the buildings to the designated fire muster area. This will be spread across the courts to increase distancing between year-group bubbles. You must behave sensibly and maintain social distancing as far as possible. You will muster in your year-group bubbles.

If the fire alarm sounds at break or lunchtime, go straight to the main tennis court and stand with your form tutor or allocated member of staff.

The End of the School Day

Wash your hands using the hand sanitiser before you leave the room.

It is important that you leave the school site safely at the end of the day. You will be dismissed in year-group bubbles at staggered times as directed by your teachers in period 5.



- Years 11, 12 and 13 at 3.30pm
- Years 7 and 10 at 3.35pm
- Years 8 and 9 at 3.40pm

Please note that due to the restructuring of the timetable, this does not mean a shortening of the amount of taught time in lessons.

It is important that you leave the school promptly. Do not wait around for others as you may then 'bump' into other year groups being dismissed later on.

- Those **catching buses** will go to the tennis courts, where you will be kept in your year groups until your bus arrives. It is important that you board the bus in your year groups and stay next to them on the bus. Please remain seated on the bus and do not move to be near someone who is not in your year-group bubble. You must not walk up and down the bus. Sit in a constant seat or area of the bus if possible so that you know the students around you in case they have to be traced as close contacts.
- Those being **collected by car** will need to meet their cars in the front car park. Please ask parents not to arrive before 3.30pm and make space in the car park as soon as you have been picked up, unless you are waiting for a sibling. No parents should get out of their cars, please.
- Those **walking** should do so sensibly, trying to stay with people from their own year-group bubble and maintaining appropriate social distancing.

All students should behave responsibly when leaving school and in your local wider communities; not congregating in large groups. Adhere to the advice given by the Government to reduce the risk you pose to others when at school.
