## The New Academic Year – 2023/24

It is with great pleasure and expectation that I would like to extend a warm welcome to Year 8. The trip to Flamingo Land, prior to the summer holidays was a fantastic day and we were fortunate with good weather for the students who attended, where they really did show off how good a year group they really are.

As Year 8 continue their journey at William Farr, I think it fitting to remind both parents and students of our school vision: 'To provide all members of the school community with the opportunities to engage with 'life in all its fullness' (John 10:10).'

This vision statement reflects our continued commitment to excellence in education as a Church school. We strive to equip young people with the knowledge, skills and understanding to be able to succeed in life and reach their full potential. Our 6 core values are **Compassion, Friendship, Respect, Perseverance, Responsibility and Wisdom**. These are embedded in all that we do and hopefully all students will feel safe and cared for.

Embedding high standards into the year group is of the upmost importance to me as Head of Year. I would like to remind you of some of the basic expectations of William Farr School, which help us to create an outstanding climate for learning:

- Students should always bring basic equipment to school pen, pencil, rubber, ruler, coloured pencils, calculator, French dictionary (if appropriate), apron. All belongings must be taken home daily.
- Students must remain seated at all times when travelling on the school bus and wear seatbelts if provided.
- Mobile phones are not allowed in school.
- Students should be educated on the potential dangers in using social media and that it is a criminal offence to distribute indecent images.
- Students must wear the correct school uniform at all times. The Uniform Code can be found on the school website <u>William Farr C of E Comprehensive School Uniform</u>

The rewards system in Year 8 is an excellent way of recognising students' endeavours and achievements. Students will receive merits from their teachers for outstanding work, exceptional effort or for positive acts around the school. Certificates are awarded for every ten merits received. In addition, students will be introduced to our Citizenship awards, which are given out during Year 8. The aim of these is to build on the positive start made by the students in Year 7 and encourage them to be good role models in school and demonstrate good citizenship. The awards will be presented in our regular celebration assemblies. I am always delighted to hear about students' achievements, both in and outside of school, and encourage you to share these with me so I can celebrate them with the rest of the year group.

Once a week, every student in school has a PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education) lesson with their Form Tutor. The Year 8 programme this term covers a range of topics including citizenship, SMART targets, finance, careers and employability, as well as consent and a session on sexism and misogyny. As in Year 7, students will have had the

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opportunity to become a Form Representative, Charity Representative or Year Representative with a role on the School Council.

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Our school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of our students this is of paramount importance. With this in mind, I would like to remind you that we will not tolerate any child-on-child abuse, which can include bullying, physical abuse, sexual violence and harassment and misogyny. We do not accept excuses such as 'banter', 'part of growing up', 'it was for a laugh'. We do not accept body shaming, sexting (consensual and non-consensual sharing of nude images and semi-nude images and videos). All reports of any of the above will be investigated and dealt with in line with school policy. Students' online behaviour also continues to be a priority and we do a lot of work educating students on keeping themselves safe, but we would appreciate parents and carers monitoring their child's online presence and to report to the police any concerns. If you would like any further information on this, or any other safeguarding matters, please contact the Designated Safeguarding Lead – Mr Muir, Assistant Headteacher or Miss Griffiths, the Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead, in school.

We have a number of students who suffer with severe nut allergies in school. Therefore, students must not bring nuts into school. This includes nuts in packed lunches and snack bars.

As Head of Year, I will endeavour to respond to phone calls the day they are made. However, I do also have teaching commitments and, therefore, returning your call the same day may not always be possible.
