Dear Parent/Guardian

I would like to extend a warm welcome back after the Christmas holidays and a Happy New Year. The spring term is an exciting and busy term for Year 9, starting with the GCSE options process. You should have already received the initial letter alongside the option blocks; this information is available on the school website in the "KS4 Options Tab" under "Students".

Key dates for the options process are:

- Options Forms Released week commencing 8 January.
- Year 9 Options Morning Tuesday 30 January (this is the perfect opportunity for students to get more information about five of the courses they are considering choosing).
- Individual Tutor Mentoring February (students will get a meeting with their Form Tutor to discuss their ideas and thought about their GCSE option choices).
- Year 9 Parents' Evening Tuesday 6 February.
- Options Forms Earliest Submission Monday 4 March.
- Careers Fair Friday 8 March.
- Options Forms Final Deadline Monday 11 March.

This term's PSHE lessons compliment the options process by focussing on careers education. We will be looking at personal qualities and skills, students will write a Career Action Plan, produce, and deliver a presentation on a specific job family, look at interview skills, part time jobs and equal opportunities. As well as starting to learn how to revise effectively and build on their study skills in preparation for next year. Your child can access a wealth of resources within school and has signed up to an excellent interactive website "KUDOS" which enables students to explore potential career pathways and option Post 16 and beyond. All students will attend our Careers Fair, where they will have the opportunity to talk to a wide range of employers, colleges, and universities. They can also make an appointment with the school's Careers Advisor, through the School Librarian, Form Tutors, or myself.

Other key dates to put in your diaries:

- **Bake Sale Friday 9 February** (our Mental Wellbeing focus this term is 'keep learning'. We are hoping students will find a new passion by trying out different extra-curricular clubs, either in or out of school, and finish the term off by trying out new recipes to raise money for charity).
- Film and Pizza Night Tuesday 27 February.
- **Reward Trip to Playzone Thursday 9 May** (after the success of our last reward trip, we are hoping even more students are going to earn an invite to our next fun filled evening by achieving an average Attitude to Learning of a B+ in the March data point and having excellent attendance and punctuality).

Excellent attendance, punctuality and organisation are crucial for students to be successful, especially this year where they are laying the foundations for their GCSEs. Please ensure your child is in school, fully equipped, before 9.00am every day, and if there is a day where your child is not able to attend, please contact the school. Can I also ask for your support with our uniform policy. Ensuring students come to school in appropriate school shoes, wearing the permitted amount of jewellery or make-up, wearing the correct school tie, and having no nail varnish or fake nails will help us to maintain our high standards and parity across the school. 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Social media continues to be an area of vigilance for parents. I would request that you still monitor your child's devices closely. The internet is an amazing place, and we want our students to get the most out of it, and to use it safely.
