

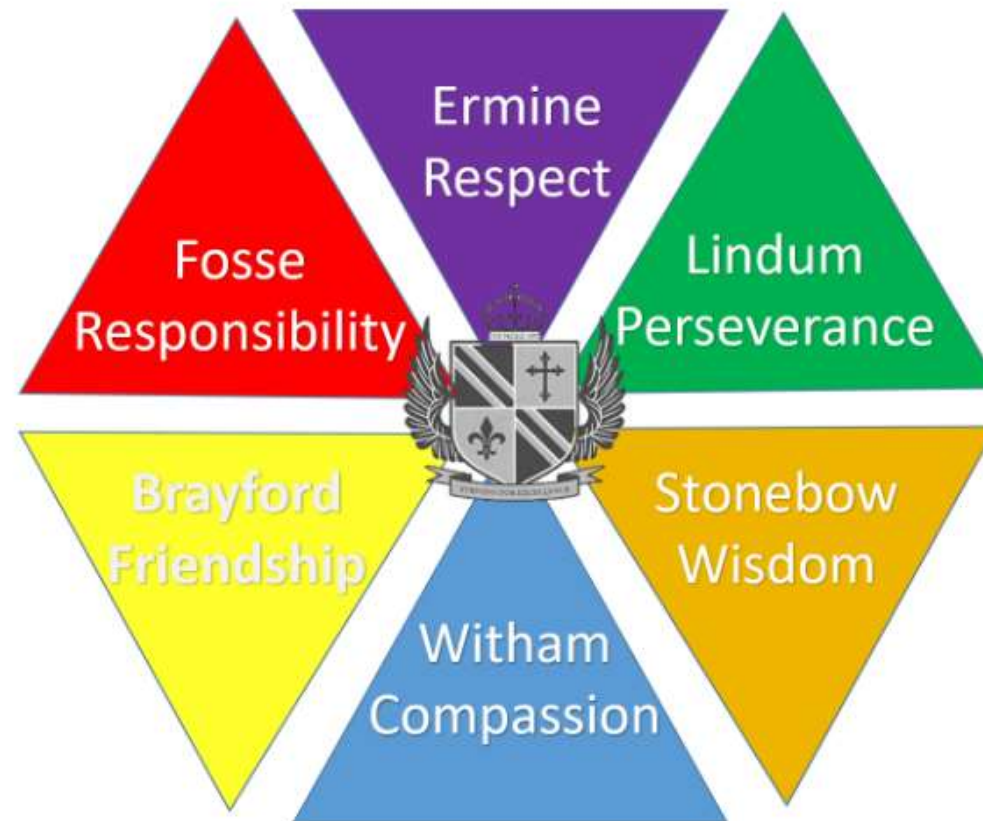

We have used prior examination papers and marking schemes, but this summer, the grade boundaries are likely to be different.

Subject Specific Criteria:

There are no mock results for OCR National (Media or Sports Studies).

Mock results in Design and Technology, Drama, Music and Physical Education are for the written examination element of the course; in the summer, the practical element will also have a considerable impact on the final grade awarded.

In French and Spanish, the speaking element has not contributed to the mock result.

In Art and Photography student's grades are reflective of incomplete coursework which is likely to change when final submissions are made.

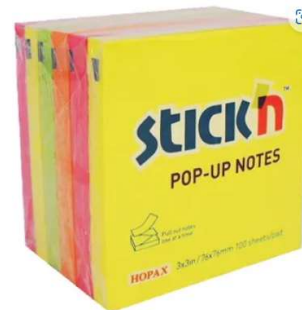

What you will need:

- ☐ appropriate apparatus such as a ruler or protractor for relevant exams

- ☐ any type of watch (this includes analogue, digital and smart watches)

- ☐ Fill in your details on the front of your answer booklet.
- ☐ If you need additional answer sheets, raise your hand and wait for an invigilator who will provide you with one. Remember to add your details to this booklet too.
